

Course Overview and Evaluation

Participation

While learning a second language, exposure and use of the language plays a large role in picking up the language. Participation in the course is critical. Students will be graded on their participation in class. This includes: partaking in class discussions, attempting pronunciations, listening and watching videos in class, daily activities in their workbook, etc. Regular attendance is crucial for this course.

Assessment

In French, you will be assessed on your ability to apply what you have learned in class into multimodal projects. You will also be assessed based on your participation in oral discussions in class as well as your completion of daily activities. Using technology such as Kahoot! And Blooket, I may use them as a pop quiz mark. Instead of a final exam, you will have a final written project as well as a final oral exam.

Missing/Late Assignments

Circumstances may arise where students miss project due-dates or oral/pop quizzes or unit exams. Missed assessments must be *made up* and handed in at the earliest possible time. Chronic absences are a cause for concern.

Final Project/Presentation: The final project and presentation are cumulative and cover in detail the content from the entire course and will be administered at the end of the term.

All resources will be printed and given to the students and will be found on their Google classroom page. There will also be a class set of French English dictionaries in the classroom for student use. Students are required to bring a **pen or pencil to every class.**
